## The Story of the Citizens Auxiliary War Services Committee

THE CITIZENS' AUXILIARY WAR SERVICES COMMITTEE of London was organized shortly after the outbreak of war, October 1939, at the request of the Department of National War Services at Ottawa.

The object of the Department in setting up Citizens' Committees in the larger centres across Canada was to avoid duplication of effort and waste in providing services to the Troops in Training in a community.

The Citizens' Committee is composed of 30 organizations in this city whose energies, it was felt, might logically be devoted in wartime to the welfare of the Troops in Training. The structure of the Committee is city-wide, however, and many problems are cleared through the Committee.

The citizens of London will be interested to know that, although the concentration of troops in and around London is very heavy as compared with other parts of Canada, the Department of National War Services considers the dispositions being carried out in London as amongst the most effective in any community in Canada.

The entertainment of the Troops through the four concert parties is but one phase of the work . . . .

#### OTHER ACTIVITIES OF THE COMMITTEE ARE AS FOLLOWS:

ACTIVE SERVICE DANCES - held twice weekly.

COLLECTION OF SALVAGE for much-needed war industry.

OPERATION OF THE ACTIVE SERVICE CLUB.

OPERATION OF A SERVICE WOMEN'S CLUB (now being established).

PROVISION OF CHAPERONED HOSTESSES for the dances and other occasions.

PROVISION OF PIANOS, RADIOS and other furnishings for recreational quarters in camps.

PROVISION OF SPORTS EQUIPMENT.

SENDING OF MEN TO HOMES for week-end hospitality.

SUMMER BAND CONCERTS.

YOUTH TRAINING THROUGH THE AIR CADETS AND SEA CADETS.

The work of the Citizens' Committee is truly a city-wide operation, carried out on behalf of all the citizens of this community.

The London Life Troupers' variety show was organized in 1940 to help provide entertainment for men on active service. All members of the troupe, with the exception of the orchestra, are members of the Head Office staff of The London Life Insurance Company. The schedule calls for a show a week during the playing season.

Fifty people make up the cast of performers, exclusive of orchestra, backstage workers, or people engaged in business management. The dance lines are trained by Miss Louise Burns of Toronto, who also designed the dance costumes. The music is under the direction of Don Wright.

Enlistments and marriages have taken a continuous toll of the cast and it may be interesting to note that of the fifty present participants only thirteen have been members of the troupe since its inception. In all, a hundred people have contributed their talents as dancers, singers, or players.




