Reunion Week Information

In This issue we present a tentative programme of the features of Reunion Week Encampment at Hastings Park, Vancouver, B. C., June 30 to July 7, 1923. Entries for athletic events should be made without delay to Walter Drinnan, Provincial Secretary G. W. V. A., 901 Dunsmuir Street, Vancouver. A fine range of cups and prizes have been secured for the various competitions, including a solid silver cup presented by Lord Byng of Vimy, Governor-General of Canada, as aggregate for ex-Service Men's events.

The cent-a-mile rate from all stations in Canada has been definitely granted to members of the Great War Veterans' Association. Certificates entitling such members to the reduced rate may be obtained from the secretaries of all Local Branches. See your G. W. V. A. Secretary for fuller particulars.

The Sixth Annual Dominion Convention of the G. W. V. A. will open at Hastings Park on Tuesday, July 3rd. The Dominion Executive will assemble for session on Saturday, June 30.

A limited tent accommodation will be available at Hastings Park for visitors attending the Reunion from a distance. Owing to Militia regulations, a small deposit will be required from all who desire this privilege, also a small charge for washing of blankets. The deposit will be refunded at the close of the week upon equipment loaned being turned in to the Orderly Room.

Colonel Jim McAra, Provincial President of the G. W. V. A. in Saskatchewan, has accepted the rank of Camp Commandant. Sergeant-Major Mortimer, of the Vancouver Police, is expected to prove the most popular Town Major that ever gave the troops the once over. While it is not intended to maintain military discipline, every visitor is expected to uphold the honor of his C. E. F. Unit, and assist in every way in making Reunion Week a success from every angle. Regulations for Guard Mounting

- Composition—One sergeant, one corporal, one bugler, twelve privates. Band or Bugle Band if available.
- Dress—Service uniform (issue), puttees, belt and straps, side arms and rifles.
- Duties—Fall in 8 p. m. ceremony changing guard, remain on duty till 9:30 p. m. Following night carry on duty from 7:30 p. m. until relieved by new guard, 8 p. m.
- DETAILS OF CEREMONIAL AND POSTS—Fall in 8 p. m., sizing guards, etc. Inspection by judging officers, march on to parade ground, ceremony judging guard, ordinary routine. Taking over posts, etc., old guard march off and dismissed; two posts, (1) double, (2) single.
- Details—One officer to be detailed each night as Orderly Officer to attend.
- Judges—Two judges to be appointed to attend each night, not belonging to any local unit.
