The Allied War Effort is in need of all the scrap iron, metal, rags and rubber that our country can collect. You are in a position to aid in this e effort and encourage our younger generation to present a united front toward a ruthless foe.

The Local Salvage Organization working through the Schools and other Organizations proposes to collect 100 tons of Scrap Iron and 50 tons of Rubber before the 30th day of November.

Metal and rubber will be collected by school drives and deposited at some convenient place in the school yard where it will be picked up by the salvage track.

Aluminum, copper, brass, bronze, zinc, lead, iron and steel are all needed. Rubber and rags are essential. (No use can be made of tin cens, automobile fenders or bodies and paper)

When you have a collection make a rough estimate of the weights, fill in the enclosed card and mail.

Every teacher and pupil engaged in this campaign will be rendering their country a vital service at a time when VICTORY will be the reward for united and wholehearted endeavor.
