Steel and stone were not enough.



HY DON'T the nations get along like one big family? A humorist answers, "The trouble is they do!"

Sound homes are the cement of national life. The place where the nation learns how to live together. The non-stop assembly line of character. If homes crack, the nation cracks.

The early settlers of Canada got faith and courage from their homes. Home-building was the foundation for nation-building. But for thousands today home means only a filling-station by day and a parking place at night. Divorce is rapidly becoming a part of Canadian life. And the birth-rate has been going down.

Teamwork

AR IN INDUSTRY can sabotage any production program. It can cripple a nation even while its forces fight heroically in the field. It can destroy the hard-won fruits of victory. And wreck the finest postwar plans.

In 1918 we won victory on the battle front, only to suffer defeat on the home front. People forgot how to pull together. Thousands exchanged the battle line for the bread line.

Canada must win the battle for industrial teamwork if this time we are to win the total victory that eluded us before. Every one has a part—worker, employer, farmer, labour leader.

Canadians know how to work hard. We must work with all we've got. Not every man for himself, but every man for his country—whatever his job.

We must work together. Friction between men slows up work more than friction in machines. More time can be lost through incendiary tempers than through incendiary bombs. If employers or workers block by teamwork by their selfishness, they sell out their country. Then the gains each fought for will be swept away.

The true battle line is not between labour and management, where some would draw it. It is between the constructive forces and the selfish forces—in both.

Plans for reconversion and post-war development depend on people, depend on us.

This is no time to haggle about our rights, or point at the other fellow. We must face up to our own mistakes—and pull together.

Then all our resources and all our manpower will be used to capacity. Work will find its true dignity and purpose. With management and labour as partners, health, happiness and security can become the lot of all.

A United

BEHIND CANADA'S FIGHTING FORCES must stand a united nation.

Nations have gone down because their people couldn't get together. They were at war inside themselves. They refused to face facts. They were caught unprepared. Even as the storm broke men schemed to get more for themselves. Groups fought for their own rights until the rights of all were swept away.

National unity is the heart of national morale. If a nation is united no subversive force can slip through and sabotage its strength.

A bomber crew isn't all made up of pilots. Every man has his part. Each depends on all the others. So with the nation. Unless we have national teamwork we are likely to have a national crack-up.

Teamwork is a combination of self-sacrifice, brains and sweat. It means working together for Canada. Honest teamwork between race and race, section and section, government and business, labour and management.

Teamwork cannot be built by high talking and low living; by fine ideals and selfish lives.

Unity is more than agreeing on what we like or whom we hate. It does not come out of expediency or appearement. It is not a question of who's right, but what's right.

At a time of crisis Abraham Lincoln listened—and preserved his nation's unity.

Lincoln said, "I have so many evidences of God's direction that I cannot doubt this power comes from above. I am satisfied that when the Almighty wants me to do or not to do any particular thing, He finds a way of letting me know it."

You don't have to be a great leader to do as Lincoln did. When you take time to be quiet and listen, God will guide your thoughts. He will give you orders. And a plan. Everybody wants national unity. What we need is to bring it down to brass tacks.

National unity doesn't just happen. It doesn't come by chance—but by change.

National unity begins with you and the fellow you don't get along with. Everybody wants to see the other fellow different. But everybody is waiting for the other fellow to begin.

Your part in national unity is to start with yourself. When you begin to change, the other fellow will sit up and take notice. Put things straight with him, and maybe he'll put things straight with you.

Honest apology starts teamwork.

Try it at home. Thousands of families are making the experiment. Mrs. Jones who was "always right" apologizes. Mr. Jones decides to be honest too. The children say, "Gee, it's great to be home now!" The neighbours keep up with the Joneses—in bringing a new spirit to their families. Backyard gossip changes to planning for the community. Planning for sound homes. Planning for a united Canada.

Do you ever blame the other province? The other section of the country? The others in your industry? The other person?

If political parties admitted where they'd been at fault, there'd be less mud-slinging and more of the

honest patriotism that builds a nation. There'd be more of a common loyalty to Canada, above party, class, race, prejudice and personal advantage.

That's not just the job of the politicians; or of management; or of labour. It is yours. You can create national unity wherever you are.

You can create the spirit and the determination that will win the war, secure the peace, and build a new world.

Fight to bring teamwork in industry.


Fight to unite the nation.


