ORGANIZATION.

TEMPORARY ESTABLISHMENT—ARMY MEDICAL CORPS.

A temporary establishment for the Canadian Army G.O. 121 Medical Corps is hereby authorized for the duration of the war or during such time as the services of officers who are given temporary commissions on this establishment may be needed.

The list of Officers to be given commissions under such establishment is to be compiled by the Assistant-Director Medical Services for each District, confirmed at Headquarters, and the names to be published from time to time in General Orders.

All Officers, temporarily employed, to be appointed to the Regimental List as Lieutenants and simultaneously to the Temporary List with whatever senior rank it may be deemed advisable to give them.

Such Officers to draw Pay and Allowances of their rank on the Temporary List according to rates laid down for C.E.F. Medical Officers in Canada for such days as they are actually employed.

The allotment and seniority of officers to be shown on the Temporary List by Districts, as any rank granted them while temporarily employed, will be local and temporary only, and will not affect seniority outside the station at which they are actually employed.

Officers who cease to be temporarily employed to be removed from the Militia List, unless eligible under the regulations re age, etc., to remain on the Regimental List should they desire to do so.

General Orders (Decorations and Medals).

The Assistant Directors of Medical Services of each Military District will be called upon to submit a list of names of medical officers already employed under conditions stated, who will be placed on the list at once, and the further selection of medical gentlemen to meet local requirements will be left to their recommendation and subsequent approval at Militia Headquarters.

The list referred to is in no way to interfere with the status of officers of the Army Medical Corps who may be granted temporary rank in the Canadian Militia beyond their substantive rank in the A.M.C. for purposes outside of special services during the war, and their temporary rank will remain shown in the general temporary list of the Canadian Militia.
