G.O. 32 IST DIVISIONAL AREA.—Canadian Engineers.— **1916.** The organization of a Field Company (with Telegraph Detachment) to be designated the 11th Field Company, Canadian Engineers, is authorized, on the distinct understanding that no expense to the public is incurred until after the war and until such time as funds are voted by Parliament.
