AMENDMENTS.****SCALE OF RATINGS.**

Article 249, Pay and Allowance Regulations, is **G.O. 36**
amended as follows:—
1916.

Meat. 1 pound or $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. beef and $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. fish.

Bacon. 3 oz. instead of 2 oz.

White sugar. 3 oz. instead of 2 oz.

Milk powder. 1 oz. instead of $1\frac{1}{2}$ oz.

Add canned vegetables. 4 oz.

To Article 250 add new sub para:—

(e) Canned vegetables may be issued when fresh
vegetables become expensive or difficult to obtain.

Supply Officers may issue the equivalent in value of
any grocery ration of the following:—

Macaroni, sago, raisins or baking powder when con-
tracts have been made for them.
