## DRESS REGULATIONS—CANADIAN DEFENCE FORCE.

1. Members of the Canadian Defence Force will wear G.O. 39 regimental badges of their Militia Unit. 1917.

2. Officers of the Canadian Defence Force will wear rank badges on the shoulder straps as laid down in Dress Regulations for Canadian Militia and not on the sleeve as worn by Officers of the Canadian Expeditionary Force.
