REGULATIONS GOVERNING RECOMMENDATIONS FOR THE MERITORIOUS SERVICE MEDAL.

MERITORIOUS SERVICE MEDAL.

G.O. 65 1917.

The following extract from a Royal Warrant, dated 3rd January, 1917, and promulgated in Army Orders of 9th same month, is published for the information of all concerned:—

"MERITORIOUS SERVICE MEDAL.

"GEORGE R. I.

"Whereas by the Royal Warrant of the 19th December, 1845, a silver medal, entitled 'The Meritorious Service Medal,' was created to be awarded to sergeants who rendered distinguished or meritorious service, and by the Royal Warrant of the 10th June, 1884, was extended to all soldiers above the rank of corporal, and by Our Warrant of the 4th October, 1916, was extended to non-commissioned officers below the rank of sergeant and to men for valuable and meritorious service;

"And whereas we are desirous of extending the conditions under which this medal may be awarded;

"It is our will and pleasure and We do hereby ordain that the Meritorious Service Medal may be awarded to warrant officers, non-commissioned officers and men who are duly recommended for the grant in respect of gallant conduct in the performance of military duty otherwise than in action against the enemy, or in saving or attempting to save the life of an officer or soldier, or for devotion to duty in a theatre of war."

war," "The following extracts from amendments of the King's Regulations and Orders for the Army, promulgated in Army Orders dated 9th January, 1917, are also published for the information of all concerned:

General Orders (Decorations and Medals)-continued.

"KING'S REGULATIONS-AMENDMENTS.

MERITORIOUS SERVICE MEDAL.

"For the first 9 lines of paragraph 1747 substitute— 1747. The form and time of recommendation for the grant of the Meritorious Service Medal depend on whether it relates to (a) devotion to duty in a theatre of war, or gallant conduct; or (b) valuable and meritorious service.

"When recommended under (a), a full report should be rendered in duplicate to the War Office through the usual channels at the time of the occurrence.....

"As regards (b), a recommendation for the medal in respect of valuable and meritorious service may be submitted only if the candidate has served for 21 years with the colours (except in the case of invalids, who may be recommended if discharged after 18 years' service), and if he has served in a regular unit. The following instructions should be followed:—

"(i) Recommendations should be in a letter form, accompanied by certified copies of the conduct sheets and records of service on A.F.B. 200. They should be forwarded direct to the War Office by the O.C. the regular unit to which the candidate belongs."

As respects the application of the foregoing extracts to the Canadian Militia, that part of General Order 104 of October, 1902, which is on page 4 of said Order, and which is under the heading: 'Medals for Meritorious Service'; and that part which is on page 6, and which is under the heading: 'Distinguished Conduct Medal and Meritorious Service Medal'; are hereby cancelled, and the following substituted therefor:

"The form and the time of recommendation for the grant of the Meritorious Medal depends on whether it relates to (a) devotion to duty in a theatre of war, or gallant conduct; or (b) valuable and meritorious service.

"When recommended under '(a)' a full report should be rendered in duplicate to Militia Headquarters at the time of the occurrence.

"As regards '(b)' a recommendation for the Medal in respect of valuable and meritorious service may be submitted only if the candidate has served in a permanent unit for 21 years (except in the case of invalids who may be recommended if discharged after 18 years' service). The following instructions should be followed:—

- "(i) Recommendations should be in a letter form, accompanied by original and certified copies of conduct sheets and records of service. They should be forwarded by the O.C. the regular unit to which the candidate belongs, through the usual channel of correspondence;
- "(ii) The application for a candidate who has been discharged or who is not then serving with a regular unit should be submitted to the O.C. the last permanent unit with which he served or to the Officer i/c Records for his recommendation and transmission through the usual channel to Militia Headquarters:
- "(iii) The character on discharge and the pension awarded should be stated in the case of a
- pensioner; " (iv) The character qualification for all applications
- under '(b)' shall be exemplary. "(v) The following are absolutely ineligible for the Meritorious Service Medal and cannot be recommended.
- "(i) A man who has been convicted by the civil power for felony or any other offence of a dis-
- graceful character; "(ii) A man who during the last 16 years of his service (a) has incurred more than six entries in the regimental conduct sheet; or (b) has been guilty of desertion or fraudulent enlistment; or (c) has been convicted by a General Court-martial or a District Court-martial; or (d) has been drunk on duty or after being warned for duty, or has been drunk while actually engaged on garrison or regimental employment; or (e) has as an n.c.o. been reduced under the Royal prerogative or under Section 183 (2) of the Army Act for an offence but not for inefficiency.

"In reckoning the entries in '(ii) (a)' credit is to be given to a soldier for any entries made in his regimental conduct sheet of gallant or distinguished-conduct. Every such entry is to be considered as a 'setoff' for this purpose against an entry for an offence in his regimental conduct sheet."
