KING'S REGULATIONS AND ORDERS FOR THE CANADIAN MILITIA, 1910, (French Translation)—AMENDMENT.

In order that the French translation of the King's Regulations and Orders for the Canadian Militia, 1910, shall have the same wording as the English version the following amendment is authorized:—

Para. 198 (b). "Avoir trente ans de service sans interruption, comme un officier, dans la milice, et".

REGULATIONS FOR CANADIAN ORDNANCE SERVICES, PART I, 1918—AMENDMENTS.

Page 80, Para. 421, line 10, after the word "pieces" add the following:—

"Unserviceable waterproof sheets and saddle covers should be held on charge by numbers, and not weight, until they are sold out of the Service.

General Orders (Organization-Nomenclature.)

When these articles are put up for sale, either by tender or auction, the following points should be observed:—

- (i) The approximate weight of each lot, in addition to the numbers for sale in such lot, should be quoted.
- (ii) Each article should be stamped with the condemned mark in several places on the fabric side."
