INSTRUCTIONS, REGULATIONS, ETC.

FINANCIAL INSTRUCTIONS AND ALLOWANCES FOR THE CANADIAN EXPEDITIONARY FORCE, 1916.—AMENDMENTS.

Article 214 is cancelled, and the following substituted with effect from 1st April 1917, so far as the Canadian Forces serving overseas are concerned:—

“Warrant Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers and Men who are authorized by Establishment, and employed as Clerks on the Headquarters of an Army Corps, Division, Divisional Artillery, Cavalry or Infantry Brigade, or at the Canadian Section, General Headquarters, 3rd Echelon, and at Headquarters, Overseas Military Forces of Canada, Headquarters of an Area or Command, or in Administrative Services and Departments, will be entitled to the following rates of Pay and Allowances:—

General Orders (Instructions, Regulations, etc.)—continued.

The Classification of Rank and File Clerks will be determined by the Head of the Service concerned, having regard to the nature of the duties performed. Before any N.C.O. or Man is placed on the special rates authorized above for Clerks, he must have served for at least one month in such capacity with ordinary regimental rates of Pay and Allowances. If his services are satisfactory, he will then under ordinary circumstances be placed on Class II rates, and will only be advanced to Class I if considered deserving, and if the nature of his duties justify the increase.

In the case of any N.C.O. or Man employed as Clerk on any existing authorized Establishment, and now in receipt of Clerk's pay, who would suffer any reduction in Pay and Allowances by reason of the above amendments, he may continue to receive his present rate, if properly entitled thereto under former Regulations."

Article 238a, Financial Instructions and Allowances for the C.E.F., 1916, is hereby cancelled, and the following substituted:—

Gratuities to stewards or other Steamship Officials will not be allowed as a charge against public funds.

DRESS REGULATIONS FOR THE CANADIAN MILITIA, 1907.—AMENDMENTS.

Page 52—10th Royal Grenadiers—

The design of cap badge authorized by Militia and General Order No. 19, 1879, is hereby cancelled, and the following substituted:—

Cap Badge.—A silver star of eight points surmounted by an Imperial Crown proper; on the star within a wreath of crimson maple leaves the Garter and Motto proper surrounding a gilt shield.

On the shield the Roman numeral "X" and in the honour point a grenade fired, both argent and fimbriated gules.

Below the Garter a gilt scroll inscribed "Ready, Aye Ready," the whole resting on a silver scroll containing the words "Royal Grenadiers," in blue.
