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Platoon Drill.

1. The object of platoon drill is to enable the platoon, when it takes its place in the company, to carry out both by day and night any movements or formation the company commander may direct, whether laid down in this manual or improvised to meet the circumstances of the moment.

2. GENERAL RULES.

The platoon may be formed as follows :---

In line (as in squad drill). In column of fours, or file. In line of sections in fours or file. In column of sections.

In column of route.

The platoon commander and platoon sergeant, when the platoon is acting alone or at a distance from other platoons, will place themselves where they can best exercise supervision.

3. DRESSING.

In platoon drill the command "RIGHT (or left) DRESS," and the dressing of the sections by their commanders, will only be done for parade or instructional purposes. In all other cases the men will take up their own dressing as laid down in Infantry Training, section 37, 1914.

4. INSPECTION AND TELLING-OFF A PLATOON.

Unless otherwise ordered the platoon will fall in for inspection by its commander, in line. The inspection will usually be carried out as follows :---

PLATOON-ATTENTION, FIX-BAYONETS. REAR RANK, ONE PACE STEP BACK-MARCH. REAR RANK, RIGHT-DRESS.

The appointments, clothing, etc., will then be inspected.

UNFIX-BAYONETS. FOR INSPECTION, PORT-ARMS.

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Notes on Platoon and Company Drill to be read in conjunction with

Infantry Training.

PLATOON DRILL

The exterior of arms is inspected, and here and there a bore of a rifle. The sights must be at zero, wind gauges at central. Unless ordered to remain at the port in order to "EXAMINE—ARMS," each man when the officer has passed the next file to him will ease springs, order arms, and stand at ease, without any further word of command. The platoon will then be called to Attention, the word of command "CLOSE RANKS—MARCH" being given. The platoon will then be numbered and proved by its commander.

5. The following will act as Guides :-

- (a) When a platoon is in line, the section commander on the directing flank acts as guide, and is responsible for the maintenance of direction.
- (b) In column of sections, the front rank man on the flank of direction.
- (c) In column of fours or in file, the section commander on the directing flank.
- (d) In line of sections in fours or file, the leading man on the inner flank of the directing section will be responsible for direction, and the leading man on the inner flank of each of the other units for the correct interval.
- 6. When a supernumerary requires to pass through the ranks the two files immediately opposite him will make way on the command "MAKE—WAY." If he is coming from the front they will take a pace to the rear and a side pace outwards; if from the rear, a pace forward and a side pace outwards. They will resume their positions as soon as the officer has passed through.
- 7. When a unit in close order is on the move and is required to halt as soon as change of formation has been completed, the command will be preceded by the caution "AT THE HALT."
- 8. The left will be named as the directing flank when increasing the frontage on the right or when the left is the pivot flank.

9. A PLATOON IN LINE FORMING A LINE OF SECTIONS IN FOURS (OR FILE) MOVING IN THE SAME DIRECTION.

Platoon commander will give :

Advance in Fours (or File) from the Right of Sections, Form—Fours— Right (or Right—Turn), Sections Left—Wheel, Ouick—March. The platoon will move as directed, section commanders placing themselves two paces in front of the centre of the leading four or file of their respective sections. (A section of direction will be named.)

Note.—(i) This movement may be done from the left of sections.

(ii) In order to reform line the command will be, "ON THE LEFT, FORM —SECTIONS," on which the men will act as in squad drill. Formation will be made on the leading guides.

(iii) If on the march the words "guick—MARCH" are omitted.

(iv) When a line of sections in fours (or file) is on the march, the interval may be increased or diminished on the command, "FROM (or on) NO. — OPEN (or close) TO — PACES IN-TERVAL, REMAINDER, DOUBLE—MARCH." Section commanders giving "QUICK— MARCH" on arriving at required interval.

10. A PLATOON IN LINE FORMING COLUMN OF SECTIONS FACING THE SAME DIREC-TION.

Platoon Commander will give :

On the Right, Form Column of Sections, Remainder Right —Turn, Quick —March. The section on the right will stand fast. The remainder will be led by their leading files by the shortest route to their places in column, where they will receive from their commanders, "HALT, LEFT-TURN, RIGHT -DRESS." On the word "HALT" the right-hand man of the front rank will turn to his left, and take up his covering and distance from the front. Section commanders will dress their sections, and on completion will take post two paces in rear of the centre of their sections.

Note.—(i) When sections are strong, the command, "REMAINDER, FORM— FOURS—RIGHT," will be given instead of "REMAINDER, RIGHT—TURN."

(ii) A platoon in line may also advance in column of sections from the right.

PLATOON DRILL

11. A PLATOON IN LINE FORMING COLUMN OF SECTIONS FACING A FLANK.

Platoon Commander will give :

At the Halt, into Column, Sections Right —Form, Quick —March. The men will act as in squad drill, the right-hand man of each section acting as the pivot man of a squad. Section commanders will take post two paces in rear of the centre of their respective sections during the movement.

12. A PLATOON IN COLUMN OF SECTIONS ON THE MARCH, CHANGING DIRECTION.

Platoon Commander will give :

Change Direction—Right. The commander of the leading section will give the command, "RIGHT —FORM," and when the section is formed in the new direction, "FOR-WARD." The remaining sections on arriving at the same point will be formed successively in a similar manner.

Note.—(i) Before changing direction left a column should normally be ordered to march by the left.

(ii) A column can similarly change direction half (or quarter) right.

13. A PLATOON IN COLUMN OF SECTIONS FORMING COLUMN OF FOURS.

Platoon Commander will give :

(i) Each section will move in the (i) Advance (or required direction, forming column of Retire) in Column of Fours fours. from the Right, Form-Fours, **Right**. Sections Left (or Right) Wheel, Ouick-March.

(ii) In succes-Column of Fours from the Right.

(ii) When a column is on the march, sion Advance in sections may, if desired, advance in column of fours in succession. The commander of the leading section will give, "NO. - SECTION, FORM-FOURS, RIGHT, LEFT-WHEEL." On arriving at the same point the commander of each succeeding section will act in a similar manner.

> (iii) Sections can be moved in succession to the right or left in column of fours in a similar manner.

PLATOON DRILL

14. A PLATOON IN COLUMN OF SECTIONS FORMING LINE FACING A FLANK AND MOVING FORWARD.

Platoon Commander will give :

Into Line, Left -Form. Ouick -March.

The men will act as in squad drill. the left-hand man of each section acting on the word "FORM" as the pivot man of a squad. Section commanders taking up their positions in line during the movement. When line is formed the platoon commander will give "forward"; "BY THE LEFT."

NOTE .- If required to be done at the Halt, the command will be. "AT THE HALT, INTO LINE, LEFT-FORM. OUICK-MARCH."

15. A PLATOON IN COLUMN OF SECTIONS MOVING TO A FLANK IN COLUMN OF FOURS.

Note .- A column of fours may, if desired, increase frontage by sections in succession, in which case the platoon commander will give, "IN SUCCESSION ON THE LEFT, FORM-SECTIONS." The commander of the leading section will at once give, "ON THE LEFT, FORM-SECTION," followed by "FORWARD"; and on reaching the same point the remaining commanders will act in a similar manner. Section commanders taking post during this movement.

17. A PLATOON MOVING IN COLUMN OF FOURS FORMING COLUMN OF SECTIONS AT THE HALT FACING A FLANK.

Platoon Commander will give :

At the Halt, Facing Left-Form Column of Sections.

The commander of the leading section will halt his unit and turn it to the left, the remainder will be led by the shortest route to their positions in column, where they will receive the command "HALT, LEFT-TURN, RIGHT-DRESS." The right-hand men of the front rank will at once turn to their left and take up their covering and distance from the front.

Note .-- A platoon may advance in column of sections facing a flank.

18. A PLATOON MOVING IN COLUMN OF FOURS FORMING A LINE OF SECTIONS IN FOURS (OR FILE) MOVING IN THE SAME DIRECTION.

Platoon commander will give :

(i) On the left— Form Line of Sections in Fours (or File) at ---- Paces Interval. Re--March.


(ii) At the Halt, on the Left Form Line of Sections in Fours at ----Paces Interval. remainder Left -In-cline.


(i) The leading section will continue to lead on in quick time, the remainder will double as ordered, and on arriving at the required interval will receive from their commanders, "guick-MARCH." Commanders taking post two paces in front of the centre of their leading four or file, a section of direction will be named.

Company Drill.

OBJECT OF COMPANY DRILL.

The object of company drill is to train the four platoons to work together as parts of the same tactical unit, and to acquire flexibility and the power of rapid manœuvre within the company.

GENERAL RULES.

I. The company may be formed as follows :

(i) In line.

(ii) In close column of platoons.

- (iii) In column of platoons.
- (iv) In column of fours or file.
- (v) In line of platoons or sections in fours or file.

(vi) In column of route.

2. The positions of all commanders and supernumeraries in the various formations are shown on pages 13, 14 and 32, but during drill and manœuvres the company commander and second in command will place themselves where they can best exercise supervision.

The positions of the company second in command, the company sergeant-major, and the company quartermaster-sergeant, as shown on page 13, remain the same, whether the company is by the right or by the left.

GUIDES.

The following will act as guides :--

- (i) In line .. The section commander on the directing flank.
- (ii) In column The four section commanders on the directing flank.
- (iii) In line of platoons in fours
 The leading section commander on the inner flank of the platoon of direction. The leading section commanders of other platoons maintain intervals by changing over to flank of direction.

(iv) In column of fours When moving to the right the left will direct, when moving to the left the right will direct, section commanders being responsible for direction.

IMPORTANT POINTS.

1. Directing flank.

A company in line, column, or close column will march by the right, except when increasing frontage on the right, or when the left is the pivot flank. In column of route the left will always direct.

2. Marching off.

When it is desired to move off in column of route, the words "Column of Route" will be substituted for "Column of Fours."

NOTES.

- 1. The titles of the following movements are shown as headings. The company commander's caution or words of command appear in the margin. The detail of the movement and orders given by platoon commanders are shown opposite.
- 2. When cautions and commands are given for formations to or from one flank only, the same rule applies when forming to or from the other flank.
- 3. Movements and formations for which detail is given in fours can also be made in file or single file.

4. A company changing ranks when halted.

About—Turn.—The whole will turn about except the officers and supernumeraries, who will regain their positions by passing round the flanks or through the ranks of the company, section commanders making way for them on the command "MAKE way," by placing themselves between the files on their right or left, and afterwards aligning themselves with the front rank.

COMPANY DRILL

When any supernumerary requires to pass through the ranks from the rear, the files in front of him will make way by taking a pace forward and a pace outwards. If ranks are changed on the march section commanders will "MAKE—WAY" by checking the pace slightly and inclining outwards.

- 5. When a unit in close order is on the move and is required to halt as soon as a change of formation has been completed, the command will be preceded by the caution "AT THE HALT."
- 6. Dressing.—The following methods of dressing are used for instructional and parade purposes. In all other cases the men will take up their own dressing as laid down in Infantry Training, Sec. 37, 1914.

The command "RIGHT (or left) DRESS" will be given by the commander of the unit, and on the completion of the dressing the platoon sergeant will give the command "EYES—FRONT" and fall in.

N.B.—When forming line the company sergeantmajor will dress the whole company, and act as above.

7. Method of dressing.—On the command "RIGHT (or left)—DRESS" being given, the platoon sergeant will move out to a distance of five paces from the inner flank of his platoon. After the dressing is completed he will give the words "EYES—FRONT," and take up his original position. (If a platoon sergeant is not available, this will be done by the section commander.)

Note.—(i) The company sergeant-major is responsible for the covering off of the guides, from the platoon of formation.

(ii) When forming close column (or column) of platoons, the company sergeant-major and platoon sergeants will, after dressing, take up their original positions on the command "EYES—FRONT" being given to the last platoon to be formed.

COMPANY DRILL

A COMPANY FALLING IN WITH THE DRUM.

1. On the command "FALL IN" from the company sergeant-major the drummer will beat a double flam, upon which the right section commanders of each platoon will come to attention and take one and a half paces forward (at the order). They will be covered by the company sergeant-major, who then gives the command "STEADY." After a pause of about 4-seconds the drummer will beat a flam. upon which the company will come to attention. The drummer will then count a pause of about 4 seconds and will then beat a roll, when the company will take a pace (30 inches) to the front, count a pause of about 2 seconds, then turn their head and direct their eyes to the right, moving up the other half pace by short quick steps. When the whole of the company is steady (men still looking to the right) the drum will cease to roll, when the company will turn their heads and eves sharply to the front. The senior officer on parade then gives "COMPANY, STAND AT-EASE," "CALL THE ROLL," upon which the platoon sergeants will prepare their platoons for inspection.

2. When falling in without the drum the senior officer on parade will give the command "COMPANY, RIGHT— DRESS," upon which the company will come to attention and take a pace of 30 inches to the front, count a pause of about 2 seconds and then turn their heads, and direct their eyes, to the right, moving up the other half pace by short quick steps. When the dressing is completed the men will look to their front, and receive the command, "STAND AT—EASE," "CALL THE ROLL."

3. When a company falls in as part of a battalion, the right section commanders will, after taking the pace and a half forward, turn to their right and take up their covering, on the command "STEADY" will turn to their left.

1. A COMPANY IN CLOSE COLUMN CHANGING DIRECTION.

Company commander will give :

Change Direction Right, Right—Wheel, Quick—March. platoon, will make a partial turn to the left; the leading platoon will not turn, but will look to the right. Each man will move round on the circumference of a circle, of which the right of the leading platoon is the centre. The inner flank will direct, and the outer flank will regulate the pace, but when platoons are of unequal strength they will maintain the same relative positions as they held before the wheel. The second in command will superintend the wheel on the left flank, the company sergeant-major on the right, and the former must, in regulating the pace, watch the left guide of the rear platoon, who will continue to march at a full pace throughout, and on whose movement the march of every man in the company should be made to depend.


Forward, Mark Time, or Halt. When the company has circled round to the required angle, the command "FORWARD," "MARK TIME" or "HALT" will be given, on which all will at once turn in the required direction.

Note.—(i) When wheeling to the left it will be the duty of the company sergeant-major to watch the right guide of the rear platoon as above.

(ii) A close column moving in fours will wheel as above, the leading four of each platoon wheeling in the same manner as the leading platoon above, the fours in rear making a partial turn outwards and following round after the leading fours.



Column Movements.

1. A COMPANY IN COLUMN ON THE MARCH CHANGING DIRECTION.

Company commander will give :

Change Direction—Right. The commander of the leading platoon will give, "NO. — PLATOON, RIGHT—FORM," and when the platoon is formed in the new direction, "FOR-WARD." The remaining platoons, on arriving at the same point, will be formed successively in a similar manner.

Note.—(i) Before changing direction left a column should be ordered to march by the left.

(ii) A column can similarly change direction half or quarter right.

(iii) Platoon commanders should make sure that their outer flank has formed, and then look to their front before giving the word "FORWARD."

2. A COMPANY IN COLUMN FORMING COLUMN OF FOURS.



The leading platoon will be halted by its commander, the remainder will act as in squad drill. When each platoon is immediately in rear of its position in line it will receive from its commander, "NO. - PLATOON, RIGHT IN-CLINE," and when on the alignment, "HALT, RIGHT-DRESS."

NOTE.—(i) This movement can also be done from the halt to the halt. The company commander will give, " on THE LEFT FORM LINE, REMAINDER LEFT IN-CLINE, QUICK-MARCH," the movement being completed as above.

(ii) If it is intended to continue advancing the company commander will give, "DOUBLE-MARCH" instead of "QUICK—MARCH"; and, on reaching the alignment, platoon commanders will give. "OUICK-MARCH" instead of "HALT."




5. A COMPANY MOVING IN A LINE OF PLA-TOONS IN FOURS, FORMING COLUMN OF FOURS MOVING IN THE SAME DIRECTION.

Company commander will give :

Platoon on the Left (or Right) to the Front, Remainder, Left (or Right) Wheel. The named platoon will continue to lead on, the remainder will act as ordered, forming column of fours, platoon commanders taking up their positions during the movement.

Line Movements.

1. A COMPANY IN LINE FORMING CLOSE COLUMN (OR COLUMN) FACING THE SAME DIRECTION. FROM THE HALT TO THE HALT.

Company commander will give :

(i) On the Right, Form Close Column (or Column) of Platoons, Remainder Right—Turn (or Form— Fours, Right), Ouick—March. (i) The platoon on the right will stand fast. The remainder will be led by their guides by the shortest route to their positions in column (or close column), where they will receive from their commanders, "No. — PLATOON, HALT, LEFT—TURN, RIGHT— DRESS." On the word "HALT," the right guides will at once turn to their left and take up their covering and distance from the right guide of the platoon in front.


NOTE.—When companies are strong, the command "REMAINDER FORM— FOURS—RIGHT," will be given instead of "REMAINDER, RIGHT—TURN."

(ii) On No. — Platoon, Form Close Column (or Column) of Platoons, Remainder, Form —Fours, Inwards, Quick— March. (ii) This movement may also be done on either of the centre platoons. In this case the remaining platoons will move into their positions, left arm to left arm.

The right platoon will advance. The remainder will act as in squad drill, mark time two paces, and then lead on. When the guide of each platoon is in rear of the centre of the preceding platoon, the commander will give, "NO. — PLATOON, LEFT IN— CLINE," and on arriving in column of platoons, again "LEFT IN—CLINE."

Note.—(i) If on the march, the words "guick—MARCH" are omitted.

(ii) When companies are strong the command, "REMAINDER, FORM—FOURS, RIGHT," will be given instead of "REMAINDER, RIGHT—TURN."





LINE OF SMALL COLUMNS

MOVEMENTS IN LINE, OR LINES, OF SMALL COLUMNS FROM ANY FORMATION.

- I. These movements are of importance, as they form the link between close order drill and movements in battle. In carrying out such movements the principles laid down in Part 2 (Section 118), Infantry Training, are to be considered.
- 2. Constant practice is to be given in rapidly changing from any formation into a line or lines of platoons in fours or file, at varying intervals and distances.
- 3. From these formations lines of sections in file or single file on irregular frontages should be formed, the sections being subsequently extended as the requirements of the situation dictate.
- 4. The rapidity of such movements will depend on the clearness and completeness of the explanations and orders of the company commander.
- 5. In movements of this nature the number of executive words of command should be reduced to a minimum. and each unit should move to its place in the new formation by the shortest route and in the simplest manner, on the company commander's order " MOVE " or prearranged signal. Units will subsequently be guided only by such methods of control as could be exercised in battle.

DISMISSING.

The officers will first be ordered to fall out, when they will move in quick time to the commander of the parade, salute, and await his orders.

The company will then be dismissed, as in Section 46, Infantry Training.
