Sir Archibald was not the actual founder of the "Old Red Patch", but that was the name which he invented for the glorious old 1st Division when he succeeded General Currie in command. And, just as he applied that "mot d'honneur" to the division, so did the men apply it with great affection to him. To the troops he commanded, Sir Archibald was "Old Red Patch.'

The Divisional Commander was originally a cavalryman, Adjutant of the Lord Strathcona's Horse (Royal Canadians); but he saw the error of his ways and the reformation became complete between 1914 and 1918. He became an infantryman-as all good soldiers ought to be-and from command of the Straths he proceeded to the 7th Brigade. From that snappy outfit, he was again promoted to an even snappier one-the 1st Division. From June 1917 to demobilization, he was our commander; and under him the Old Red Patch thrived and went from glory to greater glory.

Hill 70 -Paschendaele-Arras-Amiens-Drocourt - Queant - Canal du Nord and the Pursuit to Mons were all fought under Sir Archibald's leadership. The 2nd Battalion took a hand in all of these little brawls; and Sir Archibald has been known to say that the old Battalion did quite a good spot of work in every case.

Sir Archibald lives in retirement in Kingston, enjoying that peace which comes in the twilight of a long and honourable life, enjoying also the deep and abiding affection of the soldiers he commanded and who revere him as a magnificient soldier, a great leader and a sterling comrade.

THE 2ND CANADIAN INFANTRY BATTALION C.E.F.

The 2nd Canadian Infantry Battalion, organized at VALCAR TIER on September 26th, 1914, drew its personnel chiefly from the rural regiments of Eastern Ontario; but in the original unit the largest group representation was that of the Governor General's Footguards of Ottawa, which furn shed two Company Commanders, one Adjutant, several Platoon Commanders and one whole Company to the Battalion

The unit proceeded to England with the First Canadian Contingent, leaving Gaspé Basin on October 3rd, 1914, on board the S.S. Cassandra. The winter was spent on Salisbury Plain.

In February, 1915, commanded by Colonel David Watson of Quebec, the Battalion was sent to France, and entered the trenches, under the tutelage of the North Staffordshire Regiment, at Bo.s Grenier, near Armentières.

Spectators at the opening of the Battle of Neuve Chapelle early in March, the Battalion marched north to Ypres and the gas attack, foud it in Corps Reserve at Vlamertinghe. Late at night the Second was hastened forward in support of the midnight assault of the 10th and 16th Battalions through Kitchener's Wood, west of St. Julien

At dawn on April 23, No. 1 Company, commanded by Major George Bennett of Peterborough, was almost wholly annihilated in an abortive attack against a German position south west of the Wood.

On April 24th the German onslaught, accompanied by another gas projection, ruffled along the whole front at the 2nd Battalion, and for hours the unit warded off attack after attack. Retirement orders were received early in the afternoon and the men stumbled back to the G.H.Q. Line fronting Wieltje.

The Battalion's casualties in the two days' operations numbered close to 600 all ranks.

Refitted at Bailleul, the Battalion within a few days was again in action at Festubert. The engagement at Givenchy followed, with the unit participating also in this battle.


A long period of comparative tranquility ensued, the Battalion occupying the trenches at Messines and Ploegsteert; but in April, 1916, the unit was once more in the Ypres Salient. On the 26th of that month, No. 4 Company suffered disastrously from the blowing of a German m ne at Hill 60, nearly one half of the company being exterminated.

In June the Battalion took part in the actions at Mount Sorrel and Sanctuary Wood. There followed a period of active uncertainty; but late in July the Battalion was withdrawn from the Salient, marched back to Nordausques near St. Omer, and there underwent training for the Somme.

The 2nd Battalion reached the Br'ckfields of Albert on August 30th, and next afternoon relieved the 45th Australians forward of Pozieres. On September 3rd, the Bombers and Scouts aided in the Australian attack on Mouquet Farm.

The first Canadian assault on the Somme was delivered on September 9th, in conjunction with a more extensive operation on Le Transloy Ridge. It had for its purpose the liberation of the last portion of Pozieres Ridge remaining in German hands and was preparatory to the onslaught at Courcelette.

A daylight operation, executed without preliminary bombardment, it was completely successful. Casualties were, however heavy.

The Second remained on the Somme one month more, during which it was engaged in the fighting at the Courcelette Chalk Pits and at the Regina Trench. During its six weeks there the unit's casualties totalled 695 all ranks.

The Battalion marched north to Vimy Ridge in October, 1916, and there spent the winter. It was active in raiding ventures prios to the offensive; and its part in the storming of Vimy Ridge on April 9th, 1917, was effective. The unit ended the day with patrols pushing through Farbus Wood towards the railway at Willerval.

In the ensuing weeks the line was pushed steadily across the Pla in of Douai, and on May 3rd the Battalion successfully attacked and captured the town of Fresnoy

At Hill 70 the 2nd Battalion played a notable role, relieving the attacking units of the 3rd Brigade and withstanding with utmost determination all the enemy's counter-attacks. These were delivered with extreme violence. The conduct of the Second in this action won praise from the High Command.

Late in October, the 2nd Battalion found themselves once more in the Ypres Salient; and on November 6th took part in the storming of Paschendaele Ridge and Village. Contrary to general experience, the unit's casualties in that engagement were slight despite all the hardships and privations.

The winter was passed in the vicinity of Lens and Lievin and Hill 70. On March 21st, 1918, the morning of the first great German offensive, the enemy attempted an ambitious, large scale raid against the Battalion at Hill 70. This was beaten off with very heavy losses to the enemy; and the resolute defence by the Battalion again won high praise from General Headquarters.

A week later, the 2 nd Battalion was hastened to support the 15th British Division of the Third Army south of the Scarpe, and wound up a feverish day on Telegraph Hill - and to all appearances arriving just in time to fill a breach which had laid the city of Arras open to the enemy.

For some time the 2nd Battalion held the trenches north and south of the Scarpe, but was finally withdrawn for training. This ended with the unit being whisked down to Amiens where on August 8th, 1918, the Battalion attacked. Advancing several miles the 2nd captured the village of Ignaucourt and that portion of Cayeux-en-Santerre lying south of the Luce River.


Next day the Battalion marched down the Beaucourt Valley and, deploying from column of route into attack, swept across the Plain of Santerre, capturing the villages of Beaufort and Rouvroy.

Leaving Amiens, the Battalion arrived at Tinques on the morning of August 26th, the day on which the Canadian offensive opened south of the Scarpe. On August 30th the Second attacked the Fresnes-Rouvroy Line, north of Hendecourt, seizing and holding all objectives.

On September 3rd, the 2nd Battalion pushed the front of the 1st Canadian Division forward from the Buissy Switch to the Canal du Nord, and next day rendered valued assistance to the 63rd Imperial Division in the defence of Inchy.

The storming of the Canal du Nord was accomplished on September 27th; and the 2nd Battalion in reserve for the first phase, took up the fight near the railway line running north from Bourlon and carried its position forward to the Pilgrim's Rest, close to the outskirts of Raillencourt on the Arras-Cambrai Road.. In this engagement the Battalion captured 13 German guns.

On October 12th, the Battalion relieved the 16th (Canadian Scottish) along the western bank of the Canal de la Sensee, south of Douai. Following a successful raid over the canal into the village of Ferin, the unit crossed on October 18th and initiated the Pursuit to Mons. Halted and relieved by the Royal Canadian Regiment on the Valenciennes-St. Amand tailway which traverses the Forest.of Vicoigne, the Battalion fired its last shot of the war on October 23rd, 1918

With the Army of Occupation, the 2nd Battalion marched into Germany. It was the first Canadian unit to cross the frontier. This historic event took place at Poteau, some miles east of the town of Vielsalm, from 7.55 a.m. to 9.15 a am. on the morning of December 4th, 1918. The Battalion was then the vanguard of the 1st Đivision.

The Rhine was crossed at Cologne on December 13th, and for nearly four weeks the unit garrisoned the outpost line at Lohmar and Seelscheid.

On January 10, 1919, the Battalion left Germany, returning to Hannut, about 18 miles west of Liege. Early in March orders were received to proceed to Le Havre, and from there the unit was returned to Bramshott Camp in England where on April 12th the Colours were presented by the late Sir Edward Kemp, then minister of the Overseas Military Forces of Canada.

Leaving Southampton on board the Olympic, the unit disembarked at Halifax, N.S., and entrained for Kingston, Ont., where it was demobilized on Wednesday, April 23rd, 1919 - four years to the day from its baptism of fire at the Second Battle of Ypres.

In its long period of war service the 2nd Battalion acquired many distinctions. Two members-Sergeant Leo. Clarke and Major Okill Massey Learmouth-won The VICTORIA CROSS. Unhappily both were killed.

A total of 5,211 officers and men passed through the ranks of the 2nd Battalion. Of these 1,353 were killed or died of wounds, and 2,618 were wounded. On the Menin Gate at Ypres are the names of more than 600 officers and men of the 2nd Battalion who, meeting death in the Ypres Salient, have no known grave.

Members of the 2nd Battalion fought in North Russia, in Italy, in Persia and the mountains of Kurdistan, in Siber.a and in the Balkans.

The Battalion is perpetuated in the non-permanent active militia of Canada by the Governor General's Footguards of Ottawa and the Peterborough Rangers of Peterborough, Ont.

The Colours of the Bat:alion were deposited in St. Paul's Church, Bowmanv:lle, on January 31, 1921.

The Battalion Association is affiliated with the 2nd Australian Battalion Association of New South Wales.
