

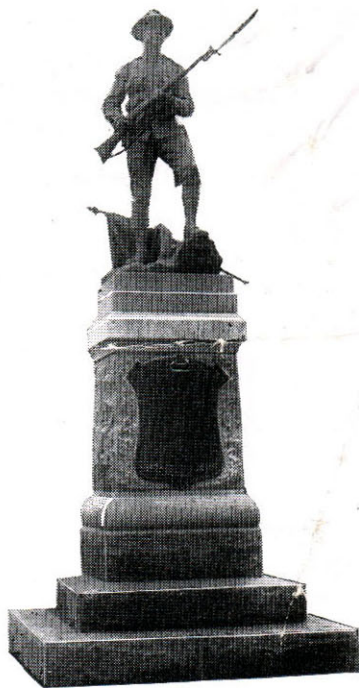
# Anweiling of Soldiers' Memorial Monument

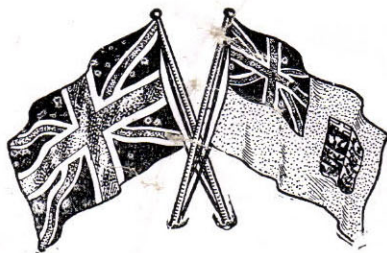
