My dear Sigrid; Well I am in the same place yet and I think I will be here for a little while anyway, there is lot of changes being made while I was away, I am on duty in a new place right at our headquarters, it is the place were I could look a the Parliament Building any time of the day and the place is very nice only it is to much military to my liking, to many Officers to salute. When I come here last Saturday night I was very tired and sleepy on Sunday I did not had much rest as I had to my clothing and equipment clean up and get the things in order, this morning I had to go on parade up till noon



and on guard at one o'clock in the afternoon untill tomorrow morning 9 o'clock but of course then I will have 24 hours off.

As the thing going on now I have good hunch that I will be in difrent part of the country befor very long, I can not tell you at the present time but some day you will be suprize when you hear from me from the part of Canada that I havent been befor, probably this will give you idea where it will be.

The weather clear and warm in daytime but its cold at nights and frost had kiled some fruit blossoms.
