**I**n this booklet, sketches of sleeve and shoulder insignia of officers of the Navy, Army and Air Force are shown for the benefit of the many people who would like to be able to recognize badges of rank.

For practical reasons the emblems of commissioned officers only are given. The badges of non-commissioned officers and tradesmen are many and varied; moreover, changing demands necessitate alterations, so that it would be impossible to present complete, up-to-the-minute reproductions.

Insignia of the senior service, the Navy, have been placed at the back

of the book instead of at the front for the sake of convenience in identifying the bands that differentiate the uniforms of officers of the three groups—the Royal Canadian Navy, the Royal Canadian Naval Reserve, and the Royal Canadian Naval Volunteer Reserve. The ranks shown in detail are those of the Royal Canadian Navy, while examples of the bands of the R.C.N.R. and the R.C.N.V.R. are on the page following.
