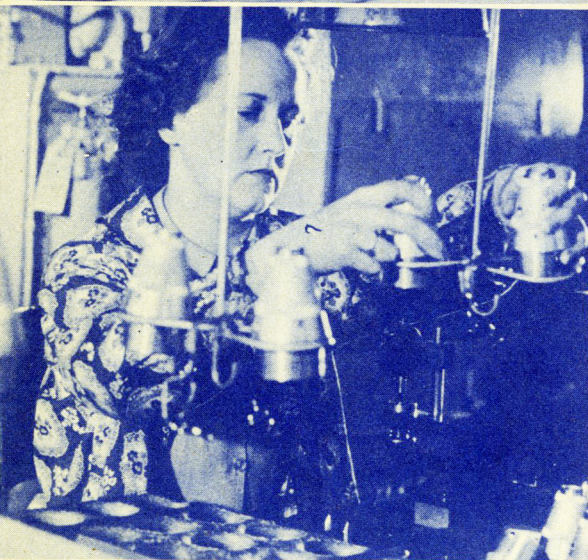
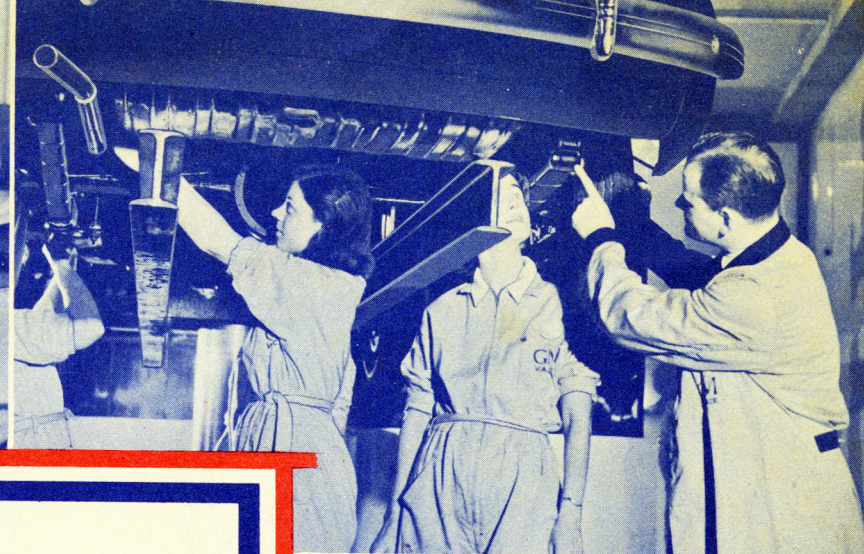
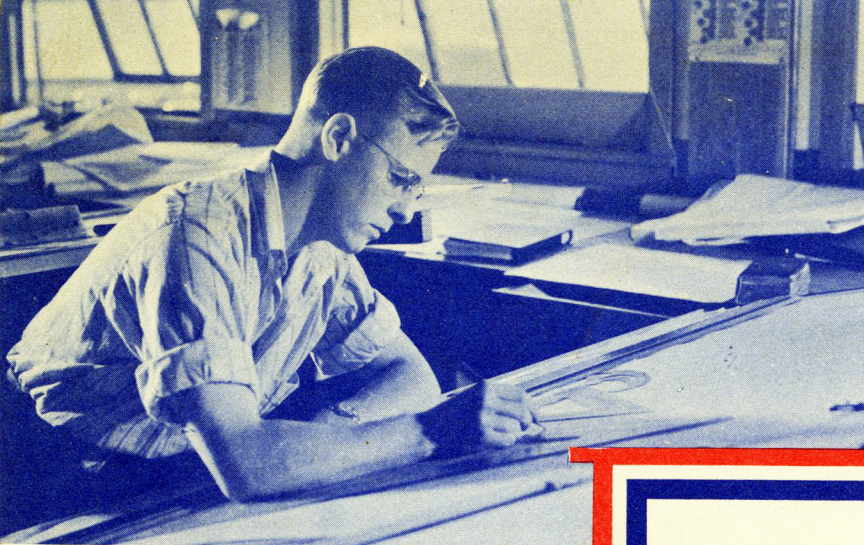

From Canada's ship yards, aircraft works and factories, the "tools to finish the job" are rolling in a ceaseless stream. Canadian-built equipment is roaring into action on every Empire battlefield.
