the 1990s, the number of people in the United States who are obese has increased by 50 percent. In 1990, 15 percent of the population was obese, and by 2000, that number had risen to 22 percent. The increase in obesity is not limited to the United States. In fact, the prevalence of obesity has increased in every country in the world, with the most dramatic increases occurring in developing countries. In 1975, only 3 percent of the world's population was obese, but by 2000, that number had risen to 10 percent. The increase in obesity is a global phenomenon, and it is a cause for concern because obesity is a major risk factor for heart disease, diabetes, and other chronic diseases.

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These results suggest that the use of a single, standardized, and validated instrument to assess the prevalence of depression in the community is feasible. The use of a single instrument may be particularly useful in the future for the purpose of conducting cross-national studies of the prevalence of depression in the community.
