## REGULATION No. 12 THE LIQUOR ACT

Upon application therefor, and upon payment of the prescribed fee, the Board may issue to persons not prohibited from purchasing liquor a permit to purchase spirituous liquor and wine in such quantities and at such times as the Board may from time to time decide within the limits of Section 29 of The Liquor Act, and no person who is prohibited from purchasing liquor may apply for and obtain such permit.

The fee for such permit shall be the sum of One Dollar.

All such permits, unless previously cancelled, shall expire on December 31st of the year for which they are issued.

In the event of the loss or destruction of a permit, application may be made, on a form provided for that purpose, for another permit to replace the one lost or destroyed and the prescribed fee of One Dollar shall accompany such application. No such replacing permit shall be issued until the calendar month in which the application so made has expired.

No person shall make application for and have issued to him more than one permit for any one year, except in a case of replacing a permit lost or destroyed.

Permit and application forms shall be in such form as the Board may decide.

Every permit shall be issued in the name of the applicant and no permit shall be transferable. The person to whom a permit is issued shall not allow any other person to use the permit nor shall any person use a permit not issued to him.

No permit is required by persons referred to in Section 224 of The Liquor Act to purchase wines for Sacramental purposes.

A person violating any of the provisions of this Regulation shall be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine of not less than \$25.00 and not more than \$50.00 and in default of payment to imprisonment of not less than seven days nor more than fourteen days.

### General Information

An applicant for a permit must be of the full age of twenty-one years.

When applying for permits, all persons, other than members of the Armed Forces, must produce their National Registration Certificates. Members of the Armed Forces must comply with the special identification requirements agreed upon from time to time between the proper authorities in that behalf and the Liquor Board.

ANY irregularity in the use of a permit will render it liable to cancellation.

Permits must be carefully preserved and kept in good condition. Any erasure, alteration, defacement or mutilation thereon will render a permit liable to cancellation.

If the purchase dates during the current month are not decipherable on a permit when it is presented at a store, a purchase may not then be made and the permit will be retained at the store until the expiration of the then current month before it may be returned to the Permittee.

Permits must be presented at the store with all orders to purchase spirituous liquors or wines.
